# FY25-26 General Operating Support II Grants (GOS II) \$3,335,608 awarded for July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2026

GOS II Grants provide general operating support to non-profit arts and/or humanities organizations located in Montgomery County, MD that have had both cash operating revenue and expenses of at least \$150,000 for the past three completed fiscal years, have a full-time paid director, and can provide an annual audit. Twenty-one organizations received FY25 awards in this category.

- Adventure Theatre, Inc., dba Adventure Theatre MTC, Glen Echo, Maryland (\$122,701) Adventure
  Theatre MTC educates and inspires new generations of theater artists and audiences with exceptional
  theatrical experiences.
- Baltimore Symphony Orchestra, Inc., North Bethesda, Maryland (\$120,720) The Baltimore Symphony
  Orchestra (BSO) performs the highest quality symphonic music of all eras that nurtures the human spirit.
  The BSO is committed to engaging, inspiring, educating, and serving diverse audiences, and to enhancing
  Maryland as a cultural center of vitality and importance.
- Bender JCC of Greater Washington, dba Bender JCC, Rockville, Maryland (\$60,796) The Bender Jewish Community Center (JCC) hosts a vibrant and robust array of arts and culture programs that engage the senses and enrich the community. The Bender JCC is committed to sustaining excellence in all presentations, including concerts and music lessons, art exhibits and classes, films, and literary events.

### FY25 General Operating Support I Grants (GOS I) \$1,291,480 awarded for July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025

GOS I Grants provide general operating support to non-profit arts and/or humanities organizations located in Montgomery County, MD that have had both annual cash operating revenue and expenses of at least \$50,000 for the past three completed fiscal years and at least one part-time paid staff member. Thirty-five organizations received FY25 awards in this category.

- Action Youth Media, Inc., dba Action Youth Media, Silver Spring, MD (\$30,000) Action Youth Media
  provides inclusive spaces where young people find their unique voices, gain self-confidence, and learn
  the media skills they need to be thriving community members. Action Youth Media promotes
  filmmaking to middle and high school students as a life-giving creative activity and a path to rewarding
  and sustainable careers.
- After School Dance Fund, Silver Spring, Maryland (\$23,250) After School Dance Fund (ASDF) provides
  artistic, technical, and financial support for the establishment and maintenance of after-school Latin

# FY25 *Advancement Grants* (AG) \$269,109 awarded for July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025

Advancement Grants provide support to non-profit arts and/or humanities organizations located in Montgomery County, MD that have had both allowable annual cash revenue and expenses of at least \$50,000 for the last three completed fiscal years. Grants support organizations in attaining fiscal stability and long-term viability, including long-term planning and technology improvements critical to an organization's arts and/or humanities mission. Eight organizations received FY25 awards within this category.

- Adventure Theatre, Inc., dba Adventure Theatre MTC, Glen Echo, Maryland (\$13,574) Funding supports the replacement of outdated lighting with modern LED lighting that will significantly lower power usage and eliminate the need to purchase color modification gels, saving unnecessary expense, and helping to make the theater eco-friendly.
- Arts For The Aging-Maryland, Inc., dba Arts for the Aging, Inc., Gaithersburg, Maryland (\$12,000) –
  Funds support improvements to Arts for the Aging (AFTA)'s website. With external technology
  consultants, AFTA will refresh and modernize their website design, functionality, and improve the
  security of their IT infrastructure.
- The Dance Exchange, Inc., dba Dance Exchange, Takoma Park, Maryland (\$65,000) Funds support the strategic planning process involving staff, Board, stakeholders, and consultants that will lead to the creation and implementation of a 50th Anniversary Capacity Building and Capital Campaign.
- Docs In Progress, Inc., dba Docs In Progress, Silver Spring, Maryland (\$10,000) Funds will be used to bolster the organization's technology infrastructure. Docs in Progress will purchase new cameras and new computers.
- Imagination Stage, Inc., Bethesda, Maryland (\$100,000) Funding supports Imagination Stage working with a revenue enhancement consultancy and campaign management firm.
- Metropolitan Ballet Theatre, Inc., dba Metropolitan Ballet Theatre and Academy, Gaithersburg, Maryland (\$14,915) – Funding supports technological enhancements, including the purchase of a new sales system, desktop computers, printers, scanners, and sound equipment.
- Montgomery County Historical Society, Inc., dba Montgomery History, Rockville, MD (\$53,620) Funds support architectural plans to ensure that the organization's new space is accessible, sustainable, and inclusive.

### FY25 Programming & Capacity Building Project Grants (PCBPG) \$387,141 awarded for July 1, 2024 – June 30, 2025

*Programming & Capacity Building Project Grants* provide support for non-profit arts and/or humanities organizations or groups that may or may not have 501(c)(3) status. Grants support high-quality programs open to the public and capacity-building projects. Forty-six organizations received FY25 awards within this category.

- Amazing Theatre Company, Inc., Gaithersburg, MD (\$9,800) Funding supports *Scars*, a new play written by Percy Thomas, reveals the impact of antisocial behavior within a family as it is passed on to children, and as it develops through social interactions in the community.
- Anna H. Wang Concert Series, Silver Spring, MD (\$9,800) Funding supports a musically collaborative program. Violinist Paul Huang will present a recital featuring violin, piano, and chamber music with a percussion ensemble.
- Best Medicine Rep, Inc., Gaithersburg, MD (\$5,820) Funding supports Blame It On Beckett, by Artistic
  Director John Morogiello, an examination of office politics within the literary office of a small,
  professional theater.
- **Bethesda Blues and Jazz Foundation,** Bethesda, MD (\$9,600) Funding supports jazz music performances by the Bethesda Blues and Jazz Youth Orchestra.
- **Bethesda Historical Society,** Bethesda, MD (\$8,730) Funding supports capacity building, using grant funds to purchase desktop computers and related office equipment, providing workstations for contract staff and volunteers. The desktops will be used for cataloging collections, centralizing record/data, improving office workflow and addressing other administrative needs.
- **Bethesda Little Theatre,** Olney, MD (\$9,700) Funding supports *Sing Me a Rainbow*, a musical revue. The theme is all the colors of the rainbow (and more), comprising a wide range of musical numbers from Broadway, the movies, standards, pop, rock, and country, featuring solos, duets, small and large ensembles, many of which will be choreographed.
- Community Building Art Works, Rockville, MD (\$9,900) Funding supports *A Day of Belonging*, a community gathering providing veterans, active-duty military, their spouses, caregivers, and community members with a day of professionally-facilitated expressive arts workshops, performances, readings, and visual art exhibits showcasing artwork created by artists from military and veteran communities, held in partnership with Strathmore.
- **DC South Asian Arts Council, Inc.,** Gaithersburg, MD (\$9,700) Funding supports the *DC South Asian Festival*, which includes screening independent films, book discussions, poetry recitations, dance performances, music performances, and panel discussions.
- **Ebong TheatriX,** Bethesda, MD (\$9,600) Funding supports a two-day, in-person theater festival.
- **F. Scott Fitzgerald Literary Conference, Inc.,** Rockville, MD (\$9,700) Funding supports a literary festival, featuring a *County Library Book Club Discussion* of the Honoree's work, short story contests for students and adults, a free evening reading in honor of the honoree, writing workshops and masterclasses for both students and adults, a bus tour about F. Scott Fitzgerald's life in Rockville, and an art contest.
- **FocusMusic,** Rockville, MD (\$5,820) Funding supports folk/acoustic/world/words-that-matter music performances, and *Local Cream Songwriter* showcases.

- Four Seasons Dancers, Inc., Rockville, MD (\$9,200) Funding supports *Dances of the World*, a globally-inspired annual performance featuring original choreography influenced by traditional cultures. The program presents a sample of dances from around the globe, with couture costumes that enhance the visual experience.
- Hope Garden Children's Ballet Theatre, Inc., Poolesville, MD (\$10,000) Funding supports A Winter's Eve, a dance production highlighting varied joyous cultural observances of the holiday season. A Winter's Eve combines excerpts from traditional ballet, Tchaikovsky's The Nutcracker, with an original adaptation of Raymond Briggs' short story The Snowman. This production merges a Christmas classic with broader cultural representation.
- Institute of Musical Traditions, Inc., Silver Spring, MD (\$3,088) Funding supports the purchase of lighting equipment, replacing old, damaged lighting.
- InterPLAY Orchestra, Inc., Derwood, MD (\$9,700) Funding supports performance production costs for three live concerts, providing people with disabilities inclusive musical experiences. The organization strives to create a safe space for artistic learning and expression, where negative stereotypes about disabilities are challenged, and people are celebrated for their abilities.
- Kassia Society for Music, Inc., Burtonsville, MD (\$9,700) Funding supports a four-concert series
  featuring premieres by ensemble members; chamber music classics; lesser-known works by
  marginalized composers such as Dora Pejacevic and Samuel Coleridge-Taylor; and works by
  contemporary composers including Marc Chan, Ioana Ilie, and Richard Ratner, centering melodic, tonal
  music outside the academic mainstream.
- Kentland Community Foundation, Gaithersburg, MD (\$9,700) Funding supports a series of programs:
   The Gaithersburg Artist Collective visuals arts program, performing arts programs led by the Kentlands
   Community Players, screenings of independent films led by the Kentlands Film Society, free live
   orchestral concerts presented by Musica Viva, and Kentlands Under the Lights, a community festival
   with local musicians.
- **Kolot HaLev, Inc.,** Kensington, MD (\$9,700) Funding supports a concert entitled *Sweet Singer of Israel Psalms that Inspire Our Lives*, a presentation of choral selections drawn from the Psalms, featuring contemporary composers as well as traditional music.

  concerto competition and free community concert. The Montgomery Symphony Orchestra will select

  American composer in honor of Juneteenth.

  new Upper Choir for 7th 8th graders. The choir already established the created Sherwood Community
  Lower Youth Choir for 35 Olney-area 4th 6th grade students in 2022. Both youth choirs will perform in
  joint concerts during the 2024-25 school year.
- Sweet Adelines International, dba Capital Accord Chorus, Silver Spring, MD (\$4,608) Funding supports engagement with diverse communities of Montgomery County through a cappella music performed in the barbershop style. Workshops, rehearsals and performances will build on learning and relationships that emerged from year one of the chorus' Culture of Belonging project.
- Symphony of the Potomac, Glen Echo, MD (\$9,600) Funding supports four classical orchestra concerts at the Montgomery College Cultural Arts Center (MCCAC), featuring approximately 50 volunteer musicians and 14 paid professional musicians, all under the direction of Music Director, Maestro Joel Lazar.
- Tagore Music Group of Greater Washington DC, Inc., North Potomac, MD (\$9,300) Funding supports four short plays. The contents of the plays will be substantially different from one another, showcasing the creativity of the Nobel-laureate poet/philosopher/playwright Rabindranath Tagore.
- Takoma Park Folk Festival, Inc., Takoma Park, MD (\$9,600) Funding supports *The Takoma Park Folk Festival*, an annual community event held in Montgomery County coordinated by a team of volunteers. The event hosts local musicians from a variety of genres, local craft activities, vendors, as well as games to join the local community together. The Festival has been a 45-year event in Takoma Park.
- The American Friends of Lafayette, Gaithersburg, MD (\$9,400) Funding supports the creation and presentation of an interactive music-theatre experience designed to recreate the historic reception of and performances for the Marquis de Lafayette upon his visit to Maryland in early October 1824. This event, coinciding with the bicentennial of Lafayette's visit to Montgomery County, celebrates this historic leader in the American and French Revolutions, and features poetry, prose, and musical outpourings given by the State of Maryland to honor him.

Students explore the creative and performative arts by participating in art therapy and trauma-informed movement.

The orchestra will collaborate with partners to encourage young artists and complete a strategic plan that involves both the orchestra and external stakeholders.

  Artistry seeks development support to increase the impact of the current development team, growing
  beyond grassroots membership with in-kind assistance, to keep up with the organization's
  programmatic expansion.

Wheaton Cultural Project Grants support impactful projects within the Wheaton, MD community and provide professional opportunities for artists and scholars to work in Wheaton. Montgomery County, MD-based non-profit arts and humanities organizations, groups, artists, and scholars are invited to apply for cultural projects taking place in Wheaton. Fifteen organizations and three individuals, a total of eighteen grantees, received FY25 awards within this category.

- APOYOnline Association for Heritage Preservation of the Americas, Inc., Rockville, Maryland (\$9,500) –
  Funding supports MANITOS A LA OBRA is a multilingual (English, Spanish, and Portuguese) hands-on
  workshop aimed to expose Latino families, specifically elementary school-aged children, to cultural
  heritage preservation and STEAM careers in the arts and humanities, empowering intergenerational
  audiences to care for their own cultural heritage and heirlooms.
- **Brian Frankel,** Silver Spring, Maryland (\$9,400) Funding supports the 11th Annual Wheaton Film Festival. The festival has run continuously in Wheaton from 2015-2024, and offers film educational panels, networking opportunities, film screenings, and an awards presentation.
- Carpe Diem Arts, Inc., Silver Spring, Maryland (\$9,800) Funding supports *Ukes on the Move*, introducing third grade students to music-making via the ukulele. The project will help young people build motor skills, understand teamwork, collaboration and enhance confidence. Students receive a ukulele, a songbook, and perform at school for the public.
- Clancy Works, Inc., dba ClancyWorks Dance Company, Silver Spring, Maryland (\$9,600) Funding supports the *Moving Wheaton: Cultural Connections* project, offering workshops and performances, in training with ClancyWorks Teaching Artists, to honor self-expression, empowerment, community, creative collaboration.

#### FY25 Arts Residencies in Schools Grants (ARSG) \$60,989 awarded for January 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025

Arts Residencies in Schools Grants support individual teaching artists based in Montgomery County, MD trained in curriculum-based art techniques to serve students from communities that have traditionally received insufficient resources and have limited access to arts education throughout the school year. Grantees are required to collaborate with a classroom teacher to develop an arts program for students during the school day. The program must benefit students in a public or non-public elementary, middle, or high school located in Montgomery County, MD. Twelve teaching artists received FY25 awards within this category.

- Adrienne Clancy, Silver Spring, Maryland (\$5,820) Funding supports a residency for Einstein High School (EHS) dance students focusing on partner work and multicultural dance forms. In collaboration with EHS Faculty and a teaching assistant of a different cultural background, the grantee will work with a core group of students to create work using improvisation, partnering, and the elements of dance.
- Arianna Ross, Poolesville, Maryland (\$5,640) Funding supports a residency for first grade students at Galway Elementary School. Students will work with the grantee to deconstruct a traditional folk tale and create their own fractured folk tale as they explore the power of word choice, understand the elements and structure of a story, and develop their dramatic skills.
- Carien Quiroga, Damascus, Maryland (\$6,000) Funding supports a unique collaboration between
  Kindergarten and fourth grade students at Flora Singer Elementary School. Led by the grantee, students
  will create a large-scale glass mosaic mural inspired by their personal heritage and traditions. The mural
  will reflect the school community as a celebration of the many cultures and voices it represents.
- Emma G, Chevy Chase, Maryland (\$5,059) Funding supports activities that will focus on songwriting as a self-empowerment tool, exploring personal narratives and creative writing as students write lyrics and explore musical concepts such as melody, rhythm and song structure. The grantee will work with 3 classrooms of fifth grade students for 5 sessions and engage the entire school in back-to-back performances.

Second graders will develop social-emotional awareness by exploring poetry about friendships and kindness. Using color, weather and nature metaphors, children will express their emotions and experiences of welcome, belonging, and exclusion through their own short, free-verse poems.
- **Khaleshia Thorpe-Price,** Montgomery Village, Maryland (\$2,300) Funding supports *Creating a Narrative Residency* which will introduce students to alternate methods of approaching and creating unique and engaging narrative writing.
- Leila Cabib, Potomac, Maryland (\$6,000) Funding supports an animation residency for fourth graders at Glenallan Elementary School. Learning about the history, science and creative possibilities of two- and three- dimensional animation, students will create three optical toys with paper, pens, pencils and an animated GIF using Stop Motion Animator. The students' GIFs will be displayed on the school's website.
- Mary Ruth McGinn, Silver Spring, Maryland (\$5,760) Funding supports a poetry residency, supported by music, visual art and theater, to strengthen writing skills and social emotional learning for fifth grade students at Georgian Forest Elementary School.
- **Noa Baum,** Silver Spring, Maryland (\$5,880) Funding supports a storytelling residency for fourth and fifth grade students at Sequoyah Elementary School. Students will explore the wide world of descriptive language and the ins and outs of character traits as they create their own colorful tales.

- **Praneetha Akula**, Silver Spring, Maryland (\$4,379) Funding supports the grantee's work with Highland Elementary School where the school will enjoy professional performances. Pre-K students will then participate in the *Talk with your Hands* residency, using classical Indian dance to increase social emotional development, literacy and fine/gross motor skills.
- **Regie Cabico,** Silver Spring, Maryland (\$5,753) Funding supports *When I Say Poetry You Say Rocks: An Introduction to Spoken Word Poetry Writing*. Workshops will utilize improvisation and experimental wordplay so students can access imagery and figurative language for ELL high school students.
- Valerie Baugh-Schlossberg, Takoma Park, Maryland (\$5,400) Funding supports a 5-session residency *Moving Through My Story*, for 5 classrooms of fourth graders at Jackson Road Elementary School, conducted during their weekly SEL time.

## FY25 Artists & Scholars Project Grants (ASPG) \$360,450 awarded for January 1, 2025 – December 31, 2025

Artists & Scholars Project Grants provide support to individual artists and scholars who reside in Montgomery County, MD. Projects can focus on the creation of new work, a phase of a larger project, a public event or program, or professional development. Seventy-four artists and scholars received FY25 awards within this category.

- Ada Ari, Gaithersburg, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports workshops for children combining storytelling, geography, movement, and music, creating a hands-on experience rooted in African culture.
- Alexander Atienza, Gaithersburg, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports Terrazzo Jungle, a film inspired
  by the paintings of Alex Colville, set in the present, and influenced by the philosophy of Charles Taylor,
  exploring themes of modernity, anomie, and nostalgia.
- Alix Evans, Silver Spring, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports *Cœur de Cour*, featuring vocal and instrumental collaborators. The project includes an exploration of medieval courtly love, medieval music and ancient languages.
- Alix Philogene (Philo), Silver Spring, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports *Hours in the Lab*, a hip-hop album depicting the story of an artist's struggles working as a practicing lawyer while maintaining a career in music, merging music and law to push African-Americans and other marginalized groups to learn about the law, and artists to learn about their intellectual property rights.
- Alla Borovskaia, Olney, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports *Garden of Inspiration*. The grantee will create floral-shaped wall sculptures made of wool fibers, incorporating photographs of community members. Participants will be invited to share their stories during the creation process.
- Allysa Mulrain (Bonnie), Silver Spring, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports recording sessions for a debut EP, blending opera, jazz, rap, pop, and rock. The lyrics focus on feminist and pro-Black themes, addressing mental health. As a female singer-songwriter of Caribbean descent, the grantee aims to amplify voices from historically marginalized communities.
- Alyscia Cunningham, Silver Spring, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports Seeing Without Sight, a
  documentary film that includes stories of girls and women who have vision loss (blind, deafblind, or low
  vision). They share their insight on what they feel is the essence of beauty without the sense of visual
  sight.
- Amber Cruz, Silver Spring, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports the creation of new paintings and ceramic sculptures. By referencing pop culture imagery in both mediums, the work aims to create tactile, visual experiences that resonate with contemporary discussions on feminine desires for escapism within the domestic landscape.
- Amir Sharifi, Rockville, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports a project benefiting elementary school
  children, who will learn about microtonal music, fostering cultural appreciation through Middle Eastern
  and Greek musical traditions. The grantee will study advanced Oud techniques and Makam music with
  Spyros Koliavasilis.
- Amy Finkelstein, Takoma Park, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports a tintype self-portrait project that challenges traditional gender assumptions while honoring the grantee's father, creating a dialogue between past and present through photography. The grantee will wear their late father's suits to explore identity, memory, and gender. Funds will cover tintype workshops, chemicals, and framing.

- **Clare Winslow,** Bethesda, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports the creation of a new body of artwork, expanding the scale of acrylic paintings and incorporating stencil techniques.
- **Daria Pomerantseva,** Chevy Chase, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports *The Threads of Migration*, a journalism and fashion project that delves into the experiences of female immigrants through recorded interviews.
- **David S. Reed,** North Bethesda, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports the grantee researching and writing a book about public sector workers in America.
- **Deborah Tomlin,** Potomac, Maryland (\$4,960) Funding supports the creation of a new paintings and drawings based on breast cancer.

- Elisabeth (Lisa) Swenton-Eppard, Gaithersburg, Maryland (\$3,600) Funding supports a professional development project: The grantee has been a tap dance artist for 38 years who teaches, directs, produces, and choreographs. The grantee will work with a professional executive coach who is also a tap dancer.
- **Fiona Rose Murphy,** Rockville, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports *Waiting for MetroAccess*, an original play loosely adapted from Samuel Beckett's *Waiting for Godot*. The play will explore timely issues affecting the disabled, queer community in the DMV.
- **Genevieve McGahey,** Silver Spring, Maryland (\$5,000) Funding supports a forum for Montgomery County freelance classical singers. The forum will provide an opportunity to gather, network, helping attendees navigate the challenges of balancing artistic pursuits with outside careers.
